

## Yellow Crookneck

### SUMMER SQUASH *Cucurbita pepo*

#### Summer Squash *Cucurbita pepo*

Compact bush plants, good for small gardens. Sow successions once a month through July where pests are a problem.

**Culture:** Direct sow when soil has reached 70°F and all danger of frost has passed. (Or, carefully transplant 2-3 week old seedlings grown indoors in pots – not flats. Avoid overwatering seeds. Harden off 2-3 days before transplanting out, and handle gently to avoid damaging the tender roots.) Provide rich, well-drained soil with plenty of organic matter and even moisture. Floating row cover accelerates early growth and protects from pests. Remove before blooms form. Succession planting provides better quality fruit over longer period.

**Harvest:** Small fruits have the best flavor. Yellow squash are easy to find against the green leaves.

**Seed Savers:** To save seeds for home planting, isolate from varieties of the same species by at least ¼ mile.
